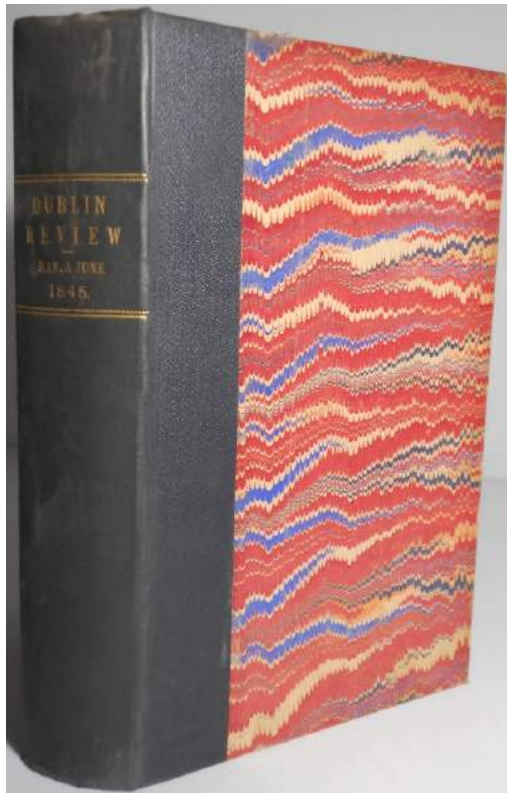

Analysis of Opium. Concerning Morphine and Meconic Acid, which are considered to be the main ingredients of Opium. **Analyse de l'Opium. De la Morphine et de l'Acide meconique, consideres comme parties essentielles de l'opium.** By Friedrich Sertuerner. 1817. The 1st French edition, published at the same time as the German edition. This is the first use of the word Morphine in a scientific paper, following Sertuerner's certain identification of the substance, which he achieved by experimenting firstly on dogs, and then on himself and three young boys, with rather inevitably near lethal consequences. Sertuerner was thus the first person to succeed in isolating an active ingredient from a plant, opening the pathway to modern alkaloid chemistry. An important work regarding a key moment in the history of science and medicine. £350. ITEM 195079

**Charles Russell. The Earl of Rosse's telescopes. 1845.**

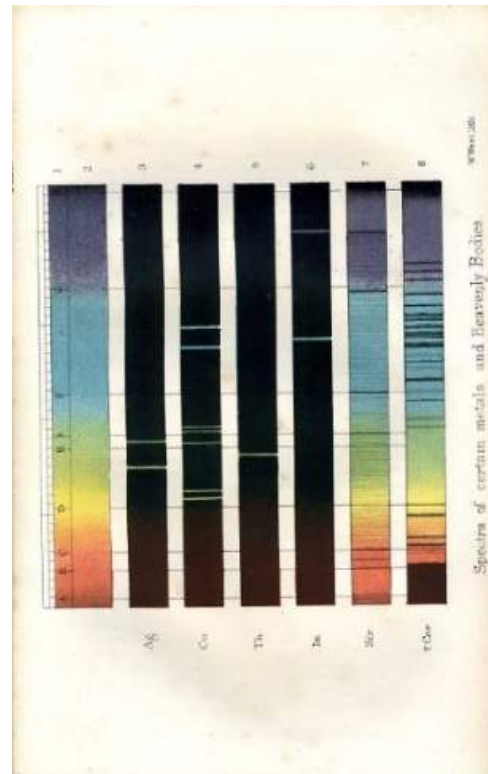
The Rosse article is 43 pages, with 4 plates. Octavo. The complete Dublin Review volume 18 (592pp, index).

The Rosse Telescopes, often referred to as the "Monster Telescopes" were so successful that within weeks of being built had discovered and observed, for the first time spiral nebulae and received public praise from John Herschel for "an achievement of such magnitude". Such was the amazement at the discoveries made by his telescope that there were even suggestions made, erroneously, that the equipment was faulty.

The Russell article is interesting for its description of the difficulties and history of telescope manufacture, through the review of four key works recently published, including two by the Earl of Rosse himself.

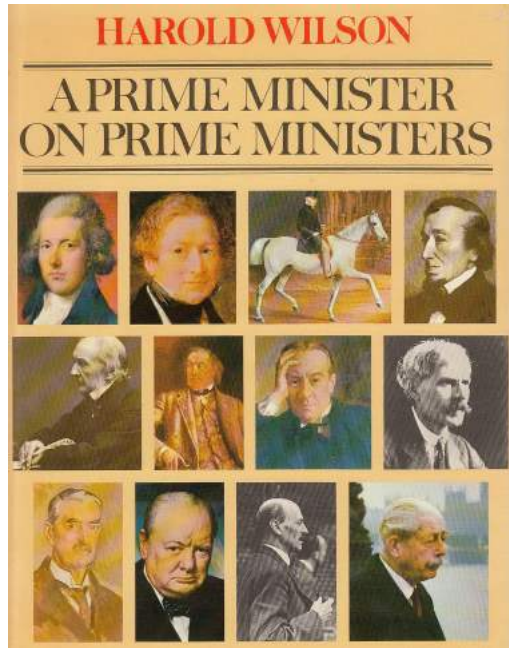

**The End of the Soviet Union. Moscow News. 1991-1991.**  
 90 Weekly Issues, An incomplete run from issue No 3456, Jan 6, 1991 to No 2596, Dec 5, 1991. Each issue is 31 x 42 cms, typically 16 pages. All issues have been half-folded, probably since

being first bought. Very little wear generally to each issue, and quite likely unread since the day following original purchase. The issues present here cover the turbulent year in the run upto to the formal dissolution of the Soviet Union in late December 1991 and its replacement with the Russian Federation, and on into the early post-Soviet era covering topics such as Yeltsin's election victory, Soviet-American treaties, growing troubles with old allied states, and the political issues surrounding Yeltsin's and Gaidar's ongoing economic "shock therapy" reforms and the subsequent social and political upheaval this created.
