THE STATE AND THE TELEPHONES.

STORY OF A BETRAYAL OF PUBLIC INTERESTS.

A SELECT Committee of the House of Commons has during the summer wrestied with one of the most complicated questions that have ever been the subject of a Parliamentary inquiry. Mr. Hambury, to whose indicative, on behalf of the Treasury, the investigation on telephones was disc, showed a firm determination to sift the problem to the bottom, and deserves the thanks of the public for the vigour he displayed. He is to be congratulated also on the speed with which the Committee insisted its labours and issued its report—a happy contrast to the action of the Sebest Committee on Telephones of 1895, which had a wider reference, but revealed less, and never reported at all. The fact is that the Traumy has waked up to the serious danger which memores the State from the between of public interests in telephones, and to the necessity of taking incondince steps to overrule the policy which the Port Office has adopted. The Committee has lifted the veil from some atmage proceedings hitherto secret, but has not closved up all the mysteries connected with a very discredible transaction.

The chief object of Mr. Hanhury's Committee was to knock holes in the cristing mesopoly of the National Telephone Company by isolated attacks from municipal perportitions. It suggests to construct some of the wrongs which have been committed, and to avert greater dangers which threaten the State. The report recommends that under serian conditions municipalities should be empowered to establish competitive telephone services, but, as I will endeavour to show, the remedy is altogether indemnate, and crosse too late, although it seems to be the ucly practical course open. The country has been allowed to slip so completely into the grip of an uncontrolled and not over-acropulous munopoly by one of the most extraordinary State.
