OCCUPATIONS FOR THE INSANE,

THERE is something very striking in the following description of the employments followed by the insan in the Glasgow Asylum, especially when we mentally contrast it with the accounts of bedlaws given by the fictitious writers of the-last century. Similar modes of engaging the attention of the insane are now followed with advantage at many other asylums throughout Britain, bysides the excellent one at Glasgow. The following is extracted from the report of the directors for 1839, during which year the average amount of patients was 159:—

"One of the most beneficial means in the treatment

"One of the most beneficial means in the treatment of the insane, is daily occupation. This not only tends to prevent the mind from dwelling on its definsions, and thereby to leasen their intensity, but frequently puts an end to that restlessness, both of mind and body, which attends many forms of the disease. Of all the modes of employing patients so affected, bodily labour is the most advantageous, insamuch as it not only produces the beneficial effects now adverted to, but contributes to bring the body into that state of health which is necessary for the due performance of health which is necessary for the due performance of all mental operations. It must always, hewever, he borne in mind, that to secure the advantages resulting borne in mind, that to secure the advantages resulting from it, the patient must be free from any high excitation, or, at least, that any excitability which may exist, is only to such an extent as to admit of its being cause, is only to such in carestias to admit of its being campletedy exhausted or subdued by labour. In the treatment of our patients we have always recognised these principles, and availed curselves of them as far as circumstances would permit. The additional plans for the employment of our patients, as alluded to in last report, have been completed; and we have now the satisfaction to state, that we have simple means of affording work to our inmates of all classes who can in any way be thereby benefited.

JAMAICA-THE EMANCIPATION.

LITTLE, we believe, is accurately known respecting the condition and habits of the negro population of our West India possessions, since the period of their the condition and habits of the negro population of our West India possessions, since the period of their final emancipation from slavery two years ago; and as we think that correct information should be disseminated on the subject, we beg to effer the following to our readers. What we state may be depended on, as far as any human testimony is worthy of credit, for we draw it from official papers lately laid before the House of Commons, and now issued in a large volume, which has been printed by authority. The topic being deeply interesting, may with advantage occupy more than a single article. We shall at present confine ourselves to Jamaica, and take up the first head, which refers to the emancipation on the last of August 1838, and its immediate consequences.

In the year 1838, the governor of Jamaica was Sir Lionel Smith, who, to judge from his dispatches, is a person of amiable disposition, and who zealously entered into the cause of emancipation. In the menth of July, he travelled through a considerable part of the island, explaining to the negroes the nature of the change which was soon to take place in their condition, and recommending them to labour for reasonable wages to the employers under whem they happened to live. The scope of these admonitions will be best understood by the following proclamation, addrassed to the predial apprentices by the governor:—

"In a few days more you will all become free labourers, the legislature of the island having relinquished the remaining two years of your apprenticeship.

The lat of August next is the happy day when you will become free, under the same laws as other freemen, whether white, black, or coloured.

I, your governor, give you joy of this great blessing. Remember that in freedom you will have to depend on your over exertions for your livelihood, and to menute the same laws as other freemens.



The manner in which thousands of persons in all parts of the United Kingdom, but England in particular, are absolutely cheated out of their money by venders of quack medicines, independently of the serious injury done to health by these pretended nestrums, is a great disgrace to our social condition. No circumstance that could be produced shows more clearly the state of ignorance among the mass of the people, than the existence of the vast delusion and credulity respecting these trumpery and often vicious preparations.

Shrewd as the English are in every matter of business, they may be described as children in all that pertains to the curing of disease. It would appear that any man, no matter who, will be almost certain to realise a fortune by manufacturing and selling pretended specifics for bodily complaints, provided he possess a sufficient share of impudence, advertise well, and keep up an imposing personal appearance. But it is not alone in England that the imposition is suceasful. Wherever there is a preponderance of English or descendants of English located, there the quack medicine-vender flourishes. All over the Englishsettled part of North America, and in the colonies, quacks are as successful as in the mother country. Every American newspaper which we see abounds with their advertisements. It has been calculated that 200,000 dollars are spent annually for advertising quack medicines in the United States. In Canada, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, and the West Indies,


